Ice Breaker:

Talk about the time when someone had the Birds & the Bees talk with you and based on that discussion did you feel prepared for sexuality later in life?

Discussion Questions:

1. Read Genesis 2:24
The sermon emphasizes that our sexuality is not just physical, but also spiritual. How do you think our culture tends to separate these two aspects of sexuality? How might recognizing the spiritual dimension change how we approach our sexuality?
2. The speaker mentions that God designed sex to be a good gift. In what ways have you seen or experienced the goodness of sexuality as a gift in your life or in the lives of others?
3. Read Romans 12:2
The distinction between conforming to the world's views on sexuality and being transformed by God's plan is discussed. How have you seen cultural norms impact people's views on sexuality? How might we intentionally pursue transformation in this area of our lives?
4. 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 is a key passage in the sermon. What stands out to you in this passage? How do you interpret Paul's message about the purpose of our bodies and our relationship with Christ in the context of sexuality?
5. Read Galatians 3:26-28 & Ephesians 1:4-8
What do these verses say about our identity in Christ. Why is it important that we keep our identity there and not in other identifiers.

Key Takeaway or Action Item:

Based on what we've discussed today, what is one specific action step you can commit to taking this week to honor God with your body and approach your sexuality in alignment with His plan?
