Discussion Guide



Can you think of a time when a small decision – good or bad – led to much bigger consequences than you expected? What happened?

Read

Take turns reading 2 Samuel 11:1-17 & Psalm 51:1-12

Discuss

The passage starts off by explaining that David is not where he should be. He is at home when he should be at war with his men.

 Are there areas of your life where you tend to lose focus, get off track, or let your guard down – especially when you're not staying active or intentional with your time and choices?

When David saw Bathsheba, he made a choice, and he acted on his temptation.

- What are some choices people make today that can lead to disaster?
- Where are you choosing something you know is leading in the wrong direction?

David makes matters worse by attempting to cover up his sin and it unfortunately ends murdering Uriah.

- Why do you think we sometimes go to great lengths to manage the fallout of a bad choice instead of just admitting it?
- What fears or pressures drive us to "dig the hole deeper"?

God Sent the prophet Nathan to confront David. David confessed his sins to God and he was immediately forgiven. David wrote Psalm 51 in response to being confronted by Nathan.

- What can we learn from David's repentance?
- · Where do you need to come clean with God today?

Application

David came clean with God and he received immediate forgiveness. God's mercy met him in his lowest moment. The same offer is on the table for us. Romans 5:8 says that WHILE were still sinners Christ died for us.

- What is your next step in coming clean with God?
- · What would it look like to stop running and start receiving grace today?
